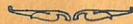

JOHN PHILIP SOUSA - THE MARCH KING



"The American Eagle shooting arrows into the aurora borealis" is the way one Frenchwoman described her reaction to John Philip Sousa when she first heard his "Stars and Stripes Forever", probably the best known military march of all time.

This alone would be a fitting accomplishment for one man, but to its composer it was only one of 215 musical compositions of various types - marches (106 of them), overtures, operas, suites, songs and fantasies - spanning a musical career of more than sixty-five years. The "March King" likewise found time to write ten books, including three novels; his autobiography, "Marching Along" is a lively, in fact, humorous account, spiced with anecdotes of the famous and not so famous, and with musical commentary. It is available at the Port Washington Library.

Mr. Sousa was born in Washington, D. C. on November 6, 1854, the son of a trombonist with the United States Marine Band. He soon set his intent on a musical career, beginning musical study of the violin at an early age. Except for a very brief period as a baker's apprentice, music remained his lifelong occupation. To deter his son from joining a circus band, the senior Mr. Sousa apprenticed young John to the U. S. Marine Band before the lad reached his fourteenth birthday; factually, John had been "sitting in" with the Band since he was ten years old. After approximately four years in his apprenticeship, he left the band to embark on a career as musician-conductor in the theatre, returning in 1880 as director of this already historic band in which he had been an apprentice only a few years prior. During this twelve years association, he was bandmaster for five presidents and brought to this proud musical organization a new eminence. This in part was due to the director's insistence on excellence. Under Mr. Sousa, the Band began its tours, a practice it continues to the present.

During his theatrical career he had met the beautiful Miss Jennie Bellis of Philadelphia and before many months had passed she became his bride. Mr. and Mrs. Sousa had three children - Philip, Priscilla and Helen. Helen, Mrs. Helen Sousa Abert, still frequently visits Port Washington, although she now lives in New York City. With a growing family and a desire to form a band of his own, the bandmaster resigned his post in 1892 to form the world renowned Sousa Band which continued with brief interruptions, for almost forty years. During this period, there were frequent European tours during which the band also played before royalty. These monarchs frequently showed their admiration and appreciation by bestowing many decorations and gifts on the composer-conductor.

In 1910, Mr. Sousa took the Band on its triumphant world tour. When World War I erupted, this former Marine bandmaster made himself available to the U. S. Navy at age 62 and continued in active service for almost two years. During this period he trained bands at the Great Lakes Naval Training Station and toured with them on Liberty Loan and Red Cross fund drives. On his retirement, a grateful Navy promoted Lieutenant Sousa to Lieutenant Commander, an honor of which he was always proud. In a busy career, he had devoted almost eighteen years to military service, and it would have been longer had not illness kept him from his appointment as head bandmaster of the Sixth Army Corps in the Spanish-American War.

The Sousa family moved to Port Washington, Long Island in 1915 and this continued as the family home until recently. It was here that the premiere performance of some of the senior Port residents still recall the erect gentleman riding around the village.

The Sousa Band resumed in 1920 with its concerts, tours and recordings; Lieutenant Commander Sousa continued to compose. He had, in fact, never stopped. However, the great heart did suddenly stop in 1932, and preceded by the Marine Band, playing a Sousa dirge, he was taken to a Washington cemetery and his final resting place.

Brief History of the John Philip Sousa Band Shell

The idea of an outdoor band shell emerged when travel restrictions during World War II prevented the High School music groups from making long trips to competition festivals. Supervisor of Music, George A. Christopher, approached former Superintendent of Schools, Mr. Paul D. Schreiber, with a proposal that concert tickets continue to be sold and that the money be used to start a fund for a music band shell, particularly honoring members and former members of the Port Washington High School Band who might possibly enter one of the services during the war. In 1954, the Music Supervisor approached the late Dr. Edwin Franko Goldman in regard to coming to Port Washington to guest conduct a concert for the purpose of adding to the money that was gradually being collected for a Sousa band shell. Dr. Goldman accepted graciously, refusing to accept any remuneration since it would be doing something, in his words, "for Mr. Sousa". The Sousa daughters, Helen and the late Priscilla entertained Dr. Goldman at dinner in their home at Sands Point, L. I.

Things stood for a long while until 1963 when Mrs. Wm. V. ("Gay") Pearsall individually initiated a concentrated drive to build a Sousa Memorial Band Shell. Things really started moving again. As Community Chairman of the American Legion Auxiliary, her activities were sponsored and assisted by them. She proceeded to write letters, phone, talk to almost every one she thought would be interested as a likely contributor. She had a compelling and ceaseless desire to really see this through. Sousa's music meant so much to so many. The fund began to grow - the PWSHS Band Alumni turned over \$1,600 for the cause - and it continued to grow - sometimes slowly, but constantly.

With the cooperation of the Chief of Police, James Rankin, George Christopher brought forth an idea that he had learned from Fred Weber, well-known composer, arranger and former school band director. This was the Mile of Dimes campaign that Mr. Weber had used so successfully in Kentucky. The actual "Mile of Dimes" program started when L'Rae Christopher held the ball and Fred Falconer representing the Port Washington Lions Club kicked off for one-hundred feet at \$2.00 per foot down Port Washington Boulevard from Campus Drive. Others involved in the campaign were "Gay" Pearsall, Mrs. Manso and the late "Bob" Manso, Mr. & Mrs. George A. Christopher, Mr. & Mrs. George B. Knowles, Mr. & Mrs. Floyd Mackey, Gilbert Beck, Steve Di-Giacomo, McCrea Cobb, Mimi, Judith, Nancy and Susan Knowles, Jeff Flowers, Bill Spence, Rick McGauley, Rose Mercagliano, Mr. & Mrs. Richard Davis and sons, Robert & George, and "Doug" Paulsen. Mrs. Helen Sousa Abert visited the Mile of Dimes and gave Mrs. Pearsall another contribution. By Mr. Sousa's birthday anniversary in 1965, the fund had passed the \$11,000 mark. As time went on the American Legion Post #509 joined with the Auxiliary in sponsoring this worthy endeavor and the handling of its permanent maintenance for which a fund has been established.

The original plan was to utilize part of one of the buildings in Sunset Park. This was found to be impractical. A great deal of credit is due to the late John M. Pollock, Henry Titus Aspinwall, Joseph G. Hnatov and Charles N. Wysong, Jr. for the guidance and assistance WITHOUT WHICH, and along with the untiring efforts of Mrs. Wm. V. Pearsall, we would not be here today.

The Board of Commissioners of the Port Washington Sewer District, composed of the late John M. Pollock, the late Fred A. Thatcher and Commissioner James A. Jennings, were approached and agreed to donate this portion of Sunset Park "for the purpose of erecting a band shell structure to be used in connection with the rendition of musical compositions in Sunset Park for the benefit of the public."

This thought has been carried on by the present commissioners, including Commissioners James A. Jennings, Robert W. Vogt and Frederick Falconer, to build the band shell in the park to beautify the area as a service to Port Washington.

We of the Port Washington Sewer District, are happy to have played a part in contributing towards sharing this accomplishment for the benefit of the people of Port Washington.

The Sousa Band Shell was designed by the architectural firm of Henry Titus Aspinwall Associates of Port Washington, who donated the services to design and produce working drawings for the structure.

Mr. Aspinwall, the senior partner of the firm, who lived in Port Washington for many years and was always very active in the community, originally accepted the responsibility of designing and preparing this memorial band shell for construction. Mr. Aspinwall has since retired and moved to Seattle, Washington, but his partners, Eugene Gerbereux and Joseph E. Hnatov, carried the project forward and are proud to have been associated with this worthwhile memorial to a distinguished resident of our community.

CAPTAIN DALE HARPHAM
ASSISTANT DIRECTOR
UNITED STATES MARINE BAND



CAPTAIN DALE HARPHAM, Assistant Director of the United States Marine Band, was appointed to his present position on May 1, 1955. Prior to his appointment to the leadership staff, he served for more than twenty years as the band's solo trombonist, cellist, vocalist, narrator of feature presentations, script writer, dance band leader, conductor of special ensembles and concert moderator.

His career began to take particular shape when, as a sixth-grade school boy in the village of Pleasant Lake, Indiana, he attended a concert by the Marine Band on concert tour in a nearby city. He promptly fell hopelessly in love with the organization and resolved to gain membership.

The vicissitudes of life experienced by this young man in his upward climb are as charming and poignant as any "strive and succeed" Horatio Alger story and with the same happy ending. In 1935, after two unsuccessful auditions in as many years, young Harpham was accepted as a musician in his favorite band.

Captain Harpham gives high praise to the public school music servants who helped him realize his goal: "I am unabashedly a product of the public school music system and have the greatest affection for those too-often unsung, talented, patient men and women who sacrifice in part their own personal technical development to encourage the artistic inclinations of the young." Summing up, he states, "I am a member of the Marine Band today because of the warm understanding and assistance of the public school music teacher."

The steps from school to bandstand to podium spanned many years of practice and private pedagogy in all facets of music; many and varied are his experiences with the great and near-great of the world. The commendations, citations and many letters of appreciation to Captain Harpham for his work, attest to his success in efficiently and effectively carrying out the mission of the Marine Band — "to provide music for the President of the United States, the Congress of the United States and the Commandant of the Marine Corps when so directed." By assuming the Assistant Directorship, Captain Dale Harpham has not only realized his boyhood dream, but his name is added to the illustrious list of the most outstanding and distinguished musicians who have guided the destiny of the country's oldest and finest military musical organization — the United States Marine Band.

Captain Harpham's limited marginal time is filled with guest appearances as conductor and adjudicator for high school and collegiate bands. Eagerly sought after, it is no mere chance that this popular bandmaster is recalled to the scenes of his former activities. Leopold Stokowski has said of him that his performances are "unusually vital" and have "a kind of electricity that is rare." Possessed with a penetrating musical insight, a keen sense of humor, Captain Harpham brings to his guest appearances the most precious of all musical gifts — the innate ability to inspire.
